Methodology

- Sample size: 2,000 adult Canadians.
- Survey field dates: October 24 to 29, 2023.
- The data was weighted by age, gender, education and region.
- Totals may not add up to 100 due to rounding.



Key Findings – Indigenous Guardians


- 1. There is clear public support for Indigenous Guardians programs in Canada.
 - 75% of Canadians support Guardians programs after reading a description of it.
 - 73% of Canadians support the federal government investing in Guardians programs to fulfil its functions.
- 2. Most Canadians are acutely aware of climate change's impacts, from increased wildfires and flooding to landslides and destruction of animal habitats and communities. Most see Indigenous Guardians playing a helpful role in mitigating all these various impacts.
- 3. When Indigenous Guardians' functions are presented to Canadians, ~8 in 10 (78% 84%) view the functions as important, from testing water quality (84%) and managing protected nature and wildlife areas (84%) to advising on emergency response tactics (81%).

Indigenous Guardians Description

Indigenous Guardians help Indigenous Nations honour their responsibility to care for lands and waters. They serve as the "eyes and ears" on their territories. They are on the ground, helping provide solutions to the challenges of climate change, loss of biodiversity, and the impacts of colonialism. Guardians are trained experts who manage lands and waters on behalf of their Nations. They monitor animals and plants, manage protected areas, and support language and cultural programs. They are on the ground, offering concrete answers to the questions of how to manage wildfire, how to reduce the risk of flooding, and how to make communities more resilient. And because Guardians work is rooted in Indigenous knowledge and culture, they help communities heal from the trauma of colonialism, including residential schools.





And to what extent do you support or oppose the federal government investing in the Indigenous Guardians program to do the work described above?


Support for federal investment in Indigenous Guardians...







Below are a number of climate change impacts that Canada has to mitigate or deal with. Before this survey, how aware were you of each of the following as an impact of climate change?


Awareness of impacts of climate change...


Key Findings – Indigenous Guardians

- 4. Canadians understand both the urgency and logic of investing in Indigenous Guardians. 7 in 10 agree:
 - Climate change and its effect on our northern boreal forests is only going to get worse (69%)
 - Federal government departments are not always best placed and nor do they have enough staff
 in locations to do this necessary climate mitigation work (71%)
 - Having Indigenous Peoples and their Nations performing these land management functions is most cost-effective approach (69%)
- 5. Most Canadians agree that Indigenous Nations are best suited to lead conservation and stewardship initiatives in their territories as they are more deeply integrated with the land (67%).
- 6. 7 in 10 Canadians prefer leveraging Indigenous Guardians programs to add more northern coverage, over having the federal government hire more conservation officers.






Which comes closer to your view...
